- 1. Describing God's Kingdom in Luke 13:19, Jesus says, "It is like a mustard seed, which a man took and planted in his garden. It grew and became a tree, and the birds perched in its branches." - 6. Jesus often withdrew to lonely places to pray. What helps you get close to God?

- 9. In Luke 10, Jesus states that Mary has chosen more wisely than Martha. Are you a Martha or a Mary?
